The traditional coffee meeting with the president has been postponed to the beginning of 2026 when he will come to present the results of the resource update.

### **Drilling Progress**

Drilling is progressing smoothly and on schedule. The teams on the ground have already completed several drillings, allowing them to collect geological data. This information helps to improve our understanding of the deposit and update our resource model. We are satisfied with the pace of operations and remain attentive to ensuring that activities are carried out in compliance with safety standards and the environment. Currently, a total of 65,005 metres have been drilled since the start of the campaign and a total of 43,035 metres remains. We now have 10 drills on site to allow us to finish in December.

#### **Commitment to communities**

Over the past few months, we have supported several local initiatives through sponsorships and donations, in order to encourage the cultural, sporting and social activities that animate Murdochville and its environment. In this section, we are pleased to share some photos of these highlights that demonstrate our desire to give back and contribute positively to the collective life.

In addition, we had the pleasure of welcoming more than 200 citizens during visits organized on the site between May and August. These meetings provided an opportunity to present the work in concrete terms, answer questions and exchange directly with community members. The enthusiasm and active participation of the visitors made these visits a real success.

In recent months, we have lent equipment to SOPFEU to help fight forest fires in the Gaspé sector. In addition, we have provided financial support to several local organizations and initiatives, including the Cercle des fermières de Murdochville, the Club FADOQ Les Montagnards, La Maison des jeunes La Cellulose, the City of Murdochville, the Murdochville Golf Club, the Côte-de-Gaspé Health Foundation, the Alzheimer Society of Gaspésie-Îles-de-la-Madeleine, the Battle of the Prospectors, the Miller Gym and the Étoile des Monts Snowmobile Club.









#### Research project with the National Research Council of Canada

Osisko Metals is innovating with a research project aimed at the real-time detection of copper and molybdenum in water at the Gaspé Mines site. Last August, the National Research Council of Canada (NRC) research team was present on the Gaspé Mines site to prepare for the implementation of this unique project. The equipment will be assembled in the laboratory over the next few months and should be installed on the site in the spring of 2026. If all goes according to plan, the Gaspé Mines site will be the first in Canada to implement such a system.

## **Progress of field inventories**

In order to prepare for the definition of a possible project, we are currently carrying out several biological inventories in the territory. These relate to flora, avifauna, the aquatic environment and bats. The objective is to better understand the richness and diversity of natural environments in order to optimize the integration of the project into the environment.

Drilling rigs are on site, which requires the movement of heavy machinery and the presence of several workers.
